Message from Mr. McGrew, Principal

BIKE RIDER SAFETY

I would like to give praise to all of our scholars who walk and ride their bicycles to school each day. After discussing with them the importance of using safety precautions while commuting to and from school, and also showing them the actual safest route to use, they have complied with our requests and are now much safer when in route to and from school.

I obtained a copy of the LRAFB Traffic Laws/Regulations from the Safety Office and will point out a few bicycle and pedestrian laws it outlines: 1. All personnel must wear a ANSI helmet. 2. Bicycle operators will ride single file and use bicycle paths when available. 3 Reflective outer garments

must be worn 30 min. before/after dark, or during dark. 4. No scooters on public streets. We have asked all scholars to use the sidewalk that runs along side of Arnold Drive if coming from base housing.

Message from the Director of Instruction. Amanda Crowder

We have made it to the end of the 1st quarter. I am excited to see the progress of many of our scholars socially and academically.

The teachers have been working very hard to ensure all scholars reach their highest potential. We need your help! All scholars have access to the IXL website. This website can be accessed at home and at school. If you or your child does not know his/her login information for IXL, then please email their math teacher. Students have the opportunity to access IXL at school during their Ramp-Up

Math class and afterschool tutoring. We are also encouraging all scholars to access this website at home or the library. The teachers receive a weekly report on the lessons that the students complete on IXL and the level of mastery for each lesson. We are implementing a reward system for IXL usage and mastery. This system will be used school wide. Please encourage your scholar to utilize IXL.

Upper Academy IXL Usage Incentives

15 hours Free Homework Pass
20 hours 5 extra credit points on a test
25 hours 20 minutes extra SPARK time
30 hours dress out for a day
35 hours listen to your MP3 for a day
40 hours teacher for a period
45 hours principal for a day
